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In an ironic twist, South Africa's record 1995/96 summer rainfall season had a negative effect on the dried fruit crop. The FAS 95 raisin production, estimated at about 30,000 tons, appears to be down about 22% compared to the previous seasons' 38,540 tons. The 1995 exports did not fare well with the result that there were considerable stocks carried over to 1996. At this stage sales have picked up and the industry is confident that exports could reach 25,000 tons this year. The devaluating South African Rand is having a positive effect on the Rand income from exports.

#### PRODUCTION

South Africa's 1995 raisin crop, which is currently still being delivered to the processors, is at this stage expected to reach only about 30,000 metric tons, compared to the 38,540 ton 1994 crop. This decrease was caused by inclement weather. In the desert along the Orange River, where 97% of the raisin crop is produced, some areas still had frost in September, while hail and wind caused damage at a later stage. South Africa had a very good 1995/96 summer rainfall season which also reached the raisin production area causing further damage. The fact that the rains also started early in the season caused damage but it was especially the late rains which really had a negative effect in production. In contrast, quality is fair. 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PRODUCT	ION				

South Africa has got about 13,000 hectares under grapes for drying along the Orange River and another 2,000 hectare further South Along the Elephants River. About 70% of the sultana grape crop is usually dried but the fresh market is growing while the wineries also take some of the grapes when the weather is not suitable for drying.

#### Production Policy

Raisins are marketed through a pool system under the auspices of the Dried Fruit Board. Producer prices consist of advance, interim and final payments. The total is, however, heavily influenced by the quality of the crop. The following table contains recent payments and the expected FAS 1995 returns;

CONSUMPTION

The consumption figures in the PS&D includes losses incurred during the cleaning and grading in the pool system.

During 1994 domestic sales amounted to 8,284 tons which means that local sales increased by less than 2%. Sales have been constant over the past few years showing only very small growth.

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STOCKS						

At the end of 1995 South Africa carried over 15,364 tons after only 7,732 tons were carried over at the end of 1994. The main reason for the increased carry over was the slow 1995 export sales but this situation is expected to turn around this year with the rate of sales already increasing.

TRADE

During 1994 South Africa exported 20,339 tons of raisins according to the Department of Customs and Excise whose figures are used in the trade matrix. The Dried Fruit Board claims 20,149 tons were exported during 1994 but the difference is small. Exports fell to 19,795 tons in 1995 in spite of the much bigger crop of higher quality. One of the reasons for the decline was the disappointing poor quality FAS 93 crop exported during 1994, coupled to strikes and shipping delays. Buyers realized late that the 1994 crop being exported during 1995 was of much better quality ans sales were slow initially leading to the big carryover at the end of the year.

The 1996 sales are going much better and faster with the result that the 1996 exports could reach 25,000 tons.

In Europe, South Africa is compelled to sell all sultana cultivars at a minimum import price (MIP) which is profitable because of the low value of the Rand against the European currencies. The value of the Rand against the Dollar plays an important role in the selling of the product. In the past favorable returns were realized at R3 to the Dollar compared to the current exchange rate of Dollar 1 = Rand 4.20. The devaluation of the Rand is helping export income realizations and producers are looking at a good payout this year, in spite of loosing their GEIS (General Export Incentive
