SESAME SEEDS WORLD OVERVIEW

Product Description

This Market Brief covers sesame seeds which are classified under the following codes:

SITC3 222.5 Sesame seeds

HS 1207.40 Sesame seeds, whole, broken, crushed or shelled.

Sesame seeds (Sesamum indicum) are also known as benniseed, gingelly, sim sim or til.

Sesamum indicum, is a herbaceous annual that probably originated in Africa. The sesame is cultivated extensively in many regions of the world, including China, India, Ethiopia, El Salvador, Nicaragua, Sudan, Mexico, Guatemala and Nigeria. Seeds are the only part of the plant utilized. Sesame seeds (approximately 50% oil and 25% protein) are used in baking, candy making, and other food products. Sesame oil, important because of its low cholesterol and high proportion of polyunsaturated fats, is used in oleomargarine, salad oils, and cooking oils. The oil can be also used in the manufacture of soaps, paints, perfumes, pharmaceuticals and insecticides. Sesame paste (Tahini) is popular in the Middle East. Sesame meal, left after oil extraction, is an excellent high-protein (34% to 50%) feed for poultry and livestock.

According to FAO, total world production was around 2.6 million metric tons in 1997. India and China were the major world producers with approximately 22.5% and 19.9% respectively of total world production in 1997. They were followed by Myanmar (12.9%) and the Sudan (12.7%).

The major importing countries are Japan, the European Union, the Republic of Korea, the United States, and Egypt. The origin of imports in these markets vary substantially. Japan imports sesame seeds mainly from China; the United States from Central America; the European Union from India and the Sudan; the Republic of Korea from the Sudan and China (see annex I for detailed statistics). The producing countries are large consumers of sesame seeds, mainly processed as cooking oil, and only part of their production is exported. In 1997 India exported 18.3% of its total production, the Sudan 25.6%, Myanmar 15.9% and China 7.3%.

^{*} Data concerning Guatemala should be read with caution as import + production figures do not match with total world imports from Guatemala.

Market characteristics

In Asia, sesame seeds are mainly processed into cooking oil. In North America and Europe, raw sesame seeds are used for toppings on breads and baked goods and in ethnic dishes. In Middle Eastern countries, they are used raw as well as for tahini paste, halvah and oil.

There are different types and qualities of sesame seeds. White seeds (white to golden color), mainly used in raw form because of their aesthetic value, are priced higher than mixed seeds (yellow to dark brown) which are generally crushed into oil. Hulled seeds and bleached hulled seeds have a higher market value. The highest quality sesame seeds are produced in Central America, more specifically in Guatemala.

Storage and packaging

Sesame seeds must be stored at a temperature of 18° Celsius and at a relative humidity of 50%. If stored at a higher temperature, the oil contained in the seeds can be rancid. Sesame seeds are generally packed for export in bags of 50 kg.

Market access

With a few exceptions, there are no trade barriers to sesame seed imports. Quality and sanitary regulations are applied in some countries and exporters must conform to the requirements of the importer or end-user. Generally, specifications concern color, cleanliness, dryness and oil content.

Prices

Sesame seed prices depend on quality specifications such as color and oil content and whether the seeds are hulled or not. In addition, prices depend on supply conditions and changes in production. Changes in the production/supply of one of the major producing countries can have a significant impact on world prices. This past season, due to the tropical storm Mitch, Honduras and Nicaragua had no production and the crop in Guatemala was partially destroyed, with the consequence of hiking prices up.

Market opportunities

In order to be competitive in the international market, producers/exporters, mainly the smaller ones, must focus on quality requirements and sanitary specifications in importing countries and pay attention to the packaging. Market prospects are good as the average increase in demand in the major importing countries amounts to approximately 5% per year, while in the EU (14% of world imports in 1997), the import growth rate averages 16% per year.

SESAME SEEDS JAPAN

Product Description

SITC3 222.5 Sesame seeds

HS 1207.40 Sesame seeds, whole, broken, crushed or shelled

Trade

There is no sesame seed production in Japan and the country relies entirely on imports for its supply. Although imports from China dropped significantly in 1997 due to an increase in China's domestic demand, China remained Japan's major supplier with 16.4% in terms of volume and 22.1% in terms of value. China was followed by Guatemala (15.9% and 18.3%) and the Sudan (13.2% and 12.6%) respectively. These two countries increased significantly their exports to Japan over the five years under review (1993-1997) with a trend of 49.4% in terms of quantity and 60.1% in terms of value for Guatemala and 55.3% and 69% respectively for the Sudan.

Market characteristics

Sesame seeds and oil are traditional health foods in Japan, where there is a strong orientation among consumers towards health products. Sesame seeds are imported by Japan and crushed into oil in the country due to differences in consumer tastes between Japan and the supplying countries, the aroma being the key factor in determining the quality of oil. Manufacturers in producing countries are trying to respond to the taste preferences of the Japanese consumer. The major sesame oil producers in Japan are Kadoya Sesame Mills and Nisshin Flour Mill.

Sesame oil is used in salad dressings (Japanese and Chinese styles), where its flavor is very important, in dipping sauces of broiled meat and in flavoring instant Chinese noodles. The seeds are used for hamburgers and traditional Japanese rice crackers.

The sesame seeds traded in Japan are, by decreasing order of importance: white (their size must be homogenous), black (they are preferred with luster) and gold. White seeds must not be mixed with seeds of other colors in order not to lose their value as ingredient. Sesame seeds containing a mixture of colors are generally used for oil production. Regarding the processed forms, parched seeds are the most traded (42%), followed by ground seeds (36%) and washed seeds (12%). Other forms account for around 10%.

Market access

No import duty is levied on sesame seeds but they are subject to two import restrictions:

- The Food Sanitation Law, concerning regulations on pesticides and radioactive pollution of seeds.
- The Plant Quarantine Law, containing standards requiring careful control in order to prevent seeds from being infected by worms and insects.

In addition the following basic specifications for imports are:

Oil content: 52%Maximum impurities: 2%

Acid value: 4 maximumFree fatty acid: 2 maximum

Distribution channels

Imports are made through trading firms. Depending on the end users, sesame seeds are then channeled through manufacturers, wholesalers, food processors or restaurants (for industrial use); through department stores, supermarkets or food shops (for home use).

Packaging

Imported sesame seeds are packed in 50-60 kg jute bags. They are generally packed in bags of 20 kg for delivery to wholesalers.

Commercial practices

Transactions of sesame seeds are generally based on C&F or FOB terms. The principal import documents include invoice, weight certificate and bill of lading.

Market opportunities

Over the past decade Japan has been by far the world largest importer of sesame seeds with a growth rate of 5.5% in the quantity imported during the period 1993-1997. Domestic demand is increasing giving rise to good opportunities to traditional and new exporters, for whom it is essential to ensure high quality and regular supply.

SESAME SEEDS EUROPEAN UNION

Product Description

SITC3 222.5 Sesame seeds

HS 1207.40 Sesame seeds, whole, broken, crushed or shelled

Trade

There is almost no production of sesame seeds in the EU where exports consist mainly of reexports. The major importing countries in the EU in 1997 were the Netherlands (27.9% of the quantity imported), Greece (22.7%) and Germany (20.8%). The major exporters to the EU in 1997 were India with a market share of 30.1% in terms of volume and 27% in terms of value, followed by the Sudan (15.4% and 13.5%) and Ethiopia (10.1% and 10.2%) respectively. These three countries significantly increased their exports to the EU during the period 1993-1997, especially Ethiopia (starting from a very low base) which had a growth rate of 644.8% in terms of volume and 716.4% in terms of value.

Market characteristics

Sesame seeds are becoming increasingly more popular as food ingredient. They are imported for direct consumption and used *on* food products, *in* food products and for oil consumption. Around 85% are used by bakeries. Consumers prefer them unpeeled, except in McDonald's restaurants where they use them peeled. Unpeeled sesame seeds are tastier and easier to conserve.

Market access

No import duty is levied on sesame seeds but importers and exporters must comply with the EU Hazard Analysis Critical Control Point (HACCP) standard which became effective the 1st of January 1996 (EU directive on hygiene for foodstuffs: 93/43/EC). The HACCP concerns foodstuffs safety. It is mandatory for all companies which process, treat, pack, transport, distribute or trade foodstuffs. More specifically, the European Spice Association (ESA) has fixed minimum quality and sanitary specifications for sesame seeds but European importing countries may fix stricter quality and sanitary standards than those specified by ESA.

Distribution channels

In EU countries importers often supply packers and processors (see addresses of selected importers in annex IV).

Prices

Sesame seed prices were quoted as follows in June 1999:

Packaging and labeling

Sesame seeds are generally packed in paper or jute bags of 25 or 50 kg for shipments in containers of about 18 to 20 metric tons. There is no mandatory type of packaging and exporters must comply with the specifications of the importers on a contractual basis.

For bulk shipments, the labeling consists of the:

- address of the exporter
- address of the importer
- country of origin
- net weight
- storage life

For small quantities, the labeling consists of the:

- name, address of the packer/exporter
- name of the product, variety and type
- country of origin
- class
- size
- net weight
- lot identification/batch number
- storage conditions

Quality standards

In most EU countries the Société générale de surveillance (SGS) carries out visual examinations of samples. Before a final purchase agreement is reached, certain importers ask laboratories to analyse samples to determine the physical characteristics of the seeds and deliver a quality certificate.

Oilseeds specifications define oil content percentages and types such as palmitic, oleic, linoleic, free fatty acid percentage, moisture content and foreign matter admixture. Standard quality sesame seeds should contain at least 40% oil and 8% moisture; color and shape of sesame seeds are important when used on food or in food products; they are less important when used for oil production. The quality of a particular shipment must be indicated, which depends on the percentage of impurities (i.e. small stones, little pieces of wood, etc.) and is called the Fair Average Quality (FAQ).

Commercial practices and sales promotion

Most importers visit producers and exporters before placing orders. Exporters are advised to visit the market they wish to export to. It is important to establish detailed contracts specifying the following points: product, price, quality, quantity, delivery terms, payment method, packaging details and arbitration authority. Once the contract is established, exporters must comply with it and pay particular attention to the delivery terms and to the high quality requirements of the European market.

Prices are generally quoted FOB or CIF in US\$. Payments are generally made by irrevocable letter of credit or cash against documents (CAD) also known as documents against payment (D/P).

Specialized food fairs enable exporters to establish personal contacts with buyers (see list of trade fairs in annex III). Exporters may also contact Import Promotion Offices (see annex II, useful addresses) to obtain additional information such as statistical data, lists of importers, trade opportunities, etc.

Market opportunities

EU imports of sesame seeds are increasing strongly over the period 1993-1997, with a trend of 16.3% in terms of quantity and 18.9% in terms of value over the period. Sesame seeds being used as an ingredient in basic foodstuffs, their consumption is not influenced by fashion and their market prospect is good. Exporters should take special care regarding delivery schedules and quality.

SESAME SEEDS REPUBLIC OF KOREA

Product Description

SITC3 222.5 Sesame seeds

HS 1207.40 Sesame seeds, whole, broken, crushed or shelled.

Trade

Until 1996, China was by far the largest exporter of sesame seeds to the Republic of Korea. In 1997 the Sudan became the Republic of Korea's major supplier with a market share of 60.3% in terms of value and 62.8% in terms of quantity. The expansion of Sudanese exports is reflected in the growth of its exports at a rate of 610.6% in terms of value and 641.6% in terms of quantity during the period 1994-1997.

Market characteristics

Sesame seed oil is a popular ingredient in food in the Republic of Korea, which depends on imports to meet domestic demand.

Market access

Duty rates levied in the Republic of Korea are 666% or 7,030 Won/kg, whichever is higher. Within WTO's tariff quota - 40%.

Distribution channels

The Republic of Korea is a large producer of sesame seeds and to protect local producers, all its imports are made through the government agency Agriculture, Fishery and Marketing Corporation (AFMC). The government policy aims to protect local producers by balancing the supply and demand and keeping producer prices high. The imported seeds are delivered to oil extractors who distribute the oil to consumers through supermarkets and foodstores.

Commercial practices

Transactions are based on C&F terms.

Packaging

Sesame seeds are usually packed in 50 kg jute bags.



SESAME SEEDS UNITED STATES

Product Description

Trade

Guatemala is by far the largest supplier of sesame seeds to the United States. The share of its exports in 1997 was 40.3% in terms of value and 36.8% in terms of quantity. It was followed by Mexico 24.4% and 24.4% respectively and in a lesser extent by India 10.2% and 13.5% respectively. Although the market share of Venezuela was low 8.8% and 9.7% respectively, the trend of its exports both in terms of value (130.7%) and quantity (114.3%) was significantly high over the period 1993-1997 (See annex I for additional statistics).

Market characteristics

The United States' imports consist mainly of high quality white seeds due to their use in hamburger buns, breads and crackers, as well as in ethnic foods. Evenness of color, cleanliness and dryness are the main purchasing criteria. Large sized natural seeds are preferred for hulling. Hulled sesame should be pearly white with a glossy finish. High quality, and thus highly priced seeds, are mainly imported from Guatemala. This explains the high trend in the value of imports from this country over the period 1993-1997 (14.7%) compared to the trend in the quantities imported (6.5%) during the same period. Both for hulled and raw sesame seeds prices depend on the harvest season. In March and April, prices are at their highest and decline monthly until the new harvest in December.

Market access

No import duty is levied on sesame seeds. The Cleanliness Specifications for Spices, Seeds and Herbs issued in June 1994 by the American Spice Trade Association (ASTA) covers the import criteria for unprocessed sesame seeds (see address in annex II).

Prices

According to ITC's Market News Service (MNS) spot prices in June 1999 were as follows in US\$ per metric ton:

From Central America:

natural: 1.325 hulled: 1.765

From India:

natural: 1.215 hulled: 1.435

Packaging

Paper bags are used for sesame seeds imported from Mexico and Central America and jute bags are used for seeds imported from Asia.

Distribution channels

Spice traders and the bakery sector are the main importers of sesame seeds which are distributed to end-users either directly or through wholesalers.

Commercial practices and sales promotion

Orders are generally placed by importers on the basis of samples. Prices are generally quoted C&F or FOB in US\$ and payments are made by letter of credit for imports from Asia, and Cash against documents for imports from Mexico and Central America.

Market opportunities

The United States is the world's fourth largest importer after Japan, the European Union and the Republic of Korea. The trend of imports was 8.85% in terms of value and 4.35% in terms of quantity over the period 1993-1997. According to trade sources, the United States will continue to offer good opportunities to traditional suppliers.
